What is a crab?

A crab is a sea creature with a flat round body covered by a shell, and five pairs of legs with large claws on the front pair. Crabs usually move sideways.

Did you know.....

- 1. Groups of crabs are called casts.
- 2. The smallest species of crab is called a **pea crab** and is only a couple of millimetres big. It is only found around the coasts of the UK, Ireland and Europe. The largest species of crab the **Japanese Spider Crab**, can grow to 4 metres long.
- 3. To communicate, crabs drum and shake their pincers.
- 4. Crabs don't have teeth in their mouths but some, such as the brown crab, have teeth in their stomachs.
- 5. Some crabs can regenerate their limbs.
- 6. A Crab's blood is blue due to the copper it contains.
- 7. There are over 4500 species of crabs.
